



Tailored Academic Guidance


Teachers at Gowerton are experienced in providing consistent support throughout A-level studies, helping you stay on track academically.

A career in Music?



For pupils hoping to follow a career in music the school has a long history of outstanding musicians. Sir Karl Jenkins has supported the school over the last 20 years by attending concerts or giving presentations. Mr Anthony Small taught at the school for over 40 years and his influence on music, especially brass playing in the community was legendary. His son Gareth Small, also a Gowertonian is Principal Trumpet with the Hallé Orchestra in Manchester. Other famous composers include Alun Hoddinott, Eric Jones, Mark Thomas, to name but a few.



Extracurricular Activities



Learning at Gowerton Sixth Form extends well beyond the classroom. It flourishes through the teams students join, the performances they take part in, and the causes they support. The wide-ranging extracurricular programme—from sports and the performing arts to volunteering and leadership roles—is designed to spark interests, challenge perspectives, and reveal new talents. These experiences not only enrich academic life but also play a key role in shaping each student's personal journey and future aspirations.

Gowerton School is fortunate to be able to provide a wide selection of Extra Curricular Activities and Sixth Form students actively play important roles with these activities. Here are a selection of some of the opportunities available.

North Gower Partnership Music Festival

Every two years the school with its partner primary schools presents a music concert at the prestigious Brangwyn Hall. 6th formers participate in the various choirs including Male Voice Choir, supported by Dunvant Male Voice, Senior girls' choir, orchestra, windband, brass band. There are also soloists or vocal ensembles from Sixth form. This is a unique event in which pupils from 3 years old to members of Dunvant Male Voice at 93 years old work together in harmony.

Annual Service of Remembrance

Every year the Sixth form participate in the Annual Service of Remembrance. Gowertonians and visitors from our local community take part in a beautiful service to remember Gowertonians that gave their lives in both World Wars. The Senior prefects read and lay wreaths in the service.

Visit to Ypres

Annually the Senior Prefect team visit Ypres to lay a wreath on behalf of the fallen of Gowerton School. This visit is part sponsored by the Gowertonian Society.

Musical Theatre Production

Every two years the school performs a Music Theatre production. Sixth formers can take part as performers on stage or by supporting in the many roles back-stage, ranging from make-up to lighting and sound. The most recent production was 'The Addams Family'.

There are regular visits to local Universities to enable students to use the sporting facilities e.g. the A Level PE trip to Cardiff Met to use the fitness testing labs.

Sixth form students have the unique opportunity to work with younger pupils, to coach, umpire and help with our extra curricular programme at school.

There are other opportunities to get qualifications and become a School Sports Ambassadors or become a Sport Ambassadors linked with Sport Wales and Swansea Council (Gold).

Duke of Edinburgh Award

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award (DofE) is a youth achievement program for pupils aged 14-24. It challenges young people to complete four or five sections: Volunteering, Physical, Skills, and Expedition, with an additional Residential section required for the Gold award.

Participants at Gowerton can earn the Bronze award in KS4 or the Gold Award in sixth form. The activities help to develop skills, build confidence, and have adventures outside of the classroom. The program is non-competitive and aims to develop universal skills valuable for employment and life.

UCAS Applications



Gowerton Sixth Form provides students with thorough, personalised support as they prepare for university.

From initial exploration to final decisions during the clearing process, students are guided every step of the way with advice tailored to their individual goals.

Our Sixth Form team collaborates with form tutors to deliver up-to-date expertise on everything from course selection to UCAS applications. Students receive help crafting strong personal statements, preparing for interviews, and navigating entrance exams with confidence.

Each student has access to their own UCAS account and benefits from one-to-one mentoring. For those applying to highly competitive universities—including Oxford and Cambridge—the HE+ programme offers advanced academic enrichment, admissions support, and focused mentoring to help them excel.




